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One of the most important character traits to me is patience. Patience is the art of waiting calmly for someone or something. Patience means waiting for someone to stop talking, so you can talk. Also it means waiting for someone to come to your house for a sleepover or something like that. Lastly, it means waiting for your teacher to give you something or waiting for her to say something instead of just talking before she is finished.

A student would show patience by letting his friend get in front of him in a big line when you only have to do a few things, and he has lots of things to do. For example, turning in homework in the morning into folders. Also, if you need to use a crayon, or marker, or glue, wait for someone to get finished instead of asking him or her over and over, “Are you done with it yet!” That gets annoying. Next, waiting for the teacher to stop talking before you ask questions, because what she might say next could answer your question.

A student would show patience at home by waiting for your mom or dad to come help you with your homework. Next, waiting for your mom or dad to cook supper, if you’re really hungry. Also waiting for your mom or dad to get off the computer, when you want to play on it.

There is a student in my class who is really patient. Whenever he needs something he waits quietly and does not bug you. Also, when he is done with work, he reads a book and does not make noise or talk to people working.

I think patience is important because you learn more when you are patient, and not talking. Also you hear everything someone says when you are quiet.
